ProLife Alert - Prayer & Action needed!

(LifeSiteNews)- In Canada, we kill the disabled. Over 90% of babies diagnosed with Down syndrome in the womb are aborted; pre-born children diagnosed with other disabilities usually meet the same fate.

With the <u>expansion of euthanasia eligibility</u> to those suffering solely from disability or mental illness scheduled to come into effect in 2027, that is slated to change. Disability groups have been nearly unanimous in their condemnation of this plan, which has been delayed twice by the Liberal government due to pushback from across Canadian society – but not cancelled entirely. Canadians with physical disabilities have been attempting to get the government's attention for years, with stories of those who seeking euthanasia because they cannot get the support or care they need periodically dominating international headlines.

The road to hell is paved with good intentions, and this is exactly what the Assisted Dying Bill opens the door to. It starts with "choice" and "dignity." But suicide isn't only done "when the patient wants it." And the countries where it is already legalized have shown us the grim reality. In the Netherlands, 40% of euthanasia deaths occur without patient consent. In Canada, it has been offered to Paralympians who only asked for a mobility aid. If it can happen there, it will happen here. People will be killed against their will!

16th Sunday: Finding God (Adoration)

"One of the greatest attacks of the enemy is to make you busy, to make you hurried, to make you noisy, to make you distracted, to fill the people of God and the Church of God with so much noise and activity that there is no room for prayer. There is no room for being alone with God. There is no room for silence. There is no room for meditation." Paul Washer

For many people prayer consists of saying prayers rather than praying. In a sense, prayer begins where expression ends. The words that reach our lips are often but waves on the surface of our being.

The most beneficial prayer of all is just to be in the presence of God, without saying or doing anything. Just to sit in his presence, as Mary sat in the presence of Jesus (attested to by Mystics, Spiritual Fathers etc). But to some this might seem a waste of time when there are so many things to do.

At a superficial glance, it might seem that Mary's part was the easier -all she had to do was sit there - and Martha's part the harder. But on reflection, we can see that at least sometimes Mary's part is by far the harder of the two. It is not easy to set aside one's own work and give one's undivided attention to another person. To give that kind of wholehearted attention to God is not easy. But it is tremendously fruitful spiritually (c.f. Luke 10:41-42).

In today's world, to be in the presence of God, without saying or doing anything, is no easy thing. Because as soon as we stop, we feel empty, even useless. Most people get their sense of self-worth from doing. A lot of people tend to equate love of God with social action. They don't know how to cope with solitude and stillness.

We need to spend time in prayer and reflection, if only to sit quietly in the presence of God (Adoration). This is not time wasted but time well spent. Each week (Friday 8am - 9am) we should try, if only for a short while, to listen to God like Mary (Luke 10:39)

We need concentrated, dedicated prayer, prayer that is like a hunger that must be satisfied and for which there was no substitute. That kind of prayer always transforms and fortifies us.

In the gospel of today, Mary taught us the essence of **silentprayer**or adoration - which is communicating with God; expressing our thoughts and feelings without vocalizing them. It is a form of prayer where the words are spoken internally, in the mind, rather than aloud.

Silent prayer is conversing with God without using audible words, focusing instead on internal dialogue and personal reflection. This type of prayer allows for a deep, intimate connection with God, emphasizing the thoughts and emotions directed towards him in quietness.

Silent prayer is slightly different from **Meditation** - while both involve silence, silent prayer in a religious context is distinct from meditation, which may focus on emptying the mind or connecting with an inner spirit (the spirit of God in you), whereas silent prayer is a form of communication with God.

Meditativeprayer is a form of prayer that involves quiet reflection and contemplation, often guided by *scripture* or other *sacredtexts*, to deepen one's connection with God. It is a practice of listening as much as speaking, allowing God's word and presence to speak to the individual. This can involve focusing on a sacred word, reflecting on scripture passages, ormeditating on the mysteries of the Rosary. Meditative prayer requires a quiet and undistracted space where one can focus on God's presence and word. Meditative prayer emphasizes the importance of being open to God's voice and guidance, rather than solely focusing on one's own words or petitions.

17th Sunday: Conversing with God

"Although there is no solution that is easy, and there is no one formula that will work for everyone with a heartache or a concern, there is One who cares very much about your situation, and He knows what you should do. That is our Father in Heaven." Margaret D. Nadauld

Prayer is essentially conversation with Almighty God, our heavenly Father. Conversation means both speaking and listening, and in prayer the latter is not less important than the former. God wants us not only to speak to him, to pour out our hearts in homage, praise and love but also to listen to him in return.

The Lord's Prayer is the quintessential prayer of the Church. It is an integral part of the major hours of the Divine Office and of the sacraments of Christian initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Integrated into the Eucharist, it reveals the eschatological character of its petitions, hoping for the Lord, "until he comes" (CCC: 2776).

"...the Lord's Prayer signifies new birth into the divine life. Since Christian prayer is our speaking to God with the very word of God, those who are "born anew through the living and abiding word of God" learn to invoke their Father by the one Word he always hears. They can henceforth do so, for the seal of the Holy Spirit's anointing is indelibly placed on their hearts, ears, lips, indeed their whole filial being." (CCC: 2769)

In this special prayer, Jesus taught us what to pray for and how to pray for it. In saying this prayer, we acknowledge God's existence. That is, we profess our belief in him and alsopraise his name.

Further, we enthrone God on earth when we pray for the coming of his kingdom - a kingdom of truth and life, holiness and grace, justice, love, and peace. In it, we pray that his will may be done on earth and in our lives too. God's will may not always be the easiest thing to do, but it is always the best thing.

While saying 'Our Father', we only ask for our basic needs - our daily bread. 'Bread' stands for all our basic needs. This is totally contrary to the flow in the society today, which is very materialistic; enslaving many as well as ruining their lives.

Next step, we move from material to the spiritual. We pray for forgiveness for our own sins, and for the grace to be able to forgive those who sin against us. As

children of God, we are urge to be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect (Matthew 5:48).

In an effort to be without stain of sin, we ask God keep us away from temptation. God does not put temptation in our path but life does. And we ourselves sometimes walk into temptation of our own accord. We are asking God to help us to cope with the temptations that come to us unbidden, and to avoid those of our own choosing.

Finally, we seek God's help in conquering the master sin – Satan. We can't expect never to encounter evil. What we are asking God for is the grace to be victorious over all evil.
