22nd Sunday: Our purpose and mission

“Stay focused on your mission, remain steadfast in your pursuit of excellence, and always do the right thing.” Mark Esper

In the gospel we heard last Sunday, Peter had recognised Jesus as the Messiah. In the biblical era, there was this perception at that time, that the Messiah would be a great military leader—another King David. No doubt, this is the kind of thing Peter had in mind too.

But in the divine plan, it has been ordained that the Messiah would suffer and be put to death. From prophecies, that was what God wanted for the salvific plan. Not that God wanted the suffering of his Son, but he wanted to show us the depth of his love for us in and through the faithfulness and love of his Son—our Lord Jesus Christ.

Unfortunately, the notion of a suffering Messiah was foreign and completely unacceptable to Peter. So, out of concern for Jesus, he tried to stop him. “Never, Lord! This shall never happen to you!” (Matthew 16:22). In doing so, he had become a stumbling block to Jesus. Though Peter had a very important role to play in his plans, Jesus was prepared to lose his friendship rather than allow him to deflect him from his destiny.

It must have been striking how Peter, who in v. 16, professed the true identity of our Lord and had received good commendation from Jesus, would in the next instance receive a strange rebuke—“get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God’s way but man’s.” (Matthew 16:21-27)

In the identity of Christ, which Peter professed earlier, is contained also his purpose and mission—salvation of the world through the way of the cross. This wish of Peter was totally against the content and requirements of achieving that purpose and mission. Christ knew his identity and was very conscious of his mission. As a true God, he was completely aware of the implications of this mission and of the intricacies therein involved.

This was the background of his rebuking Peter, whose good wishes, if they had come to pass, would have worked against realization of his mission. If Jesus hadn’t suffered and died and rose from the dead, then he would not have been the true Messiah/Christ which Peter had professed. (Matthew 16:16)

We are created for a purpose. We have a mission as Psalm 139:1-6 would say, “You have searched me, Lord, and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar....”

In line with this, we are called to be focused on our mission and to be connected always with the God who created us for such mission. We should also be conscious of the fact that what we may humanly consider as failures, sometimes may constitute the necessary elements in the direction of our realization of our mission as disciples of Jesus Christ.
