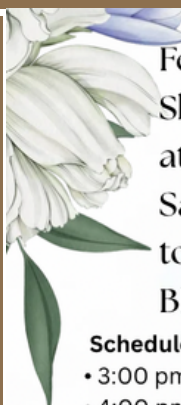

19th Sunday: Walking on water

“Courage is a special kind of knowledge: the knowledge of how to fear what ought to be feared and how not to fear what ought not to be feared.” David Ben-Gurion

Courage was Peter's master grace and that made him so forward above the rest of the apostles to express his love to Jesus; though others perhaps loved him as well. It is an instance of Peter's affection to Jesus, that he desired to come to him walking on water. When Peter saw Jesus, he was impatient to be with him. He did not say, 'let me come to you', as desiring it for the miracle sake but as desiring it for Christ's sake.

This gospel story of Peter attempting to walk on water has great relevance for us. 'Walking on water' is a symbol of something that is impossible to unaided human beings. Aristotle said, "You will never do anything in this world without courage. It is the greatest quality of the mind next to honor."

At some time, every disciple of Jesus is faced with very trying circumstances, very difficult decisions, very great sorrows, very powerful temptations. There can be many situations in which we feel weak and powerless. At those times it is as if we are being asked to 'walk on water'.

When the going gets tough, we can draw courage from the example of Peter. Peter represents typical disciples, like you and me, who are caught between faith and doubt. He set out to obey Jesus, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, that is, cynicism, busy schedules, internet..., his faith failed him.

This rebuke from Jesus – 'man of little faith' 'Why did you doubt', is directed at us too. Like Peter, we often start out courageously only to lose heart when the going gets tough. We have to contend not only with an outer struggle, but also with an inner struggle. To some extent, the whole life of a Christian is a kind of 'walking on water', in so far as it implies walking in faith, and also relying on the word of Jesus.

While Peter kept his eye fixed upon Jesus, and upon his word and power, he walked upon the water well enough but when he took notice of the danger he was in, and observed how the sea lift up their waves, then he feared. "Courage is resistance to fear, mastery of fear, not absence of fear." Mark Twain

The effect of this fear was he began to sink. When our faith is kept up, we remained up above water, but when our faith staggers, we start to sinking. So, the sinking of our spirits is owing to the weakness of our faith (*but not death of faith*).

Through the strength of Christ we are borne up above the world, enabled to trample upon it, kept from sinking into it, from being overwhelmed by it, obtain a victory over it (1 John 5:4).

When Christ is coming towards us in a way of mercy, we must go forth to meet him in a way of duty and we must be willing and bold to confide in him and rely on him. “Do not lose courage in considering your own imperfections.” St. Francis de Sales

Jesus Christ’s hand is still stretched out to all believers, to keep them from sinking. Those whom he had once made his own through baptism, he will save out of the water too.
