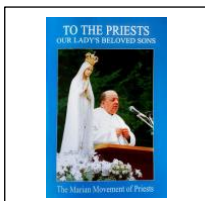

Saints of the Week: July 17 The Blessed Martyrs of Compiègne

In November 1792, a small group of Discalced Carmelite nuns of Compiègne began reciting a prayer every day, offering themselves for the salvation of France. Their prayer was answered. They were guillotined at the Place du Trône Renversé (now called Place de la Nation), Paris, on July 17, 1794. They are the first sufferers under the French Revolution on whom the Holy See has passed judgement, and were solemnly beatified on May 27, 1906. Before their execution they knelt and chanted the “Veni Creator”, as at a profession, after which they all renewed aloud their baptismal and religious vows. The novice was executed first the prioress last. Absolute silence prevailed the whole time that the executions were proceeding. The heads and bodies of the martyrs were interred in a deep sand-pit about thirty feet square in a cemetery at Picpus. As this sand-pit was also the receptacle of the bodies of 1298 victims of the Revolution, there seems to be no hope of their relics being ever recovered.

Saints of the Week: July 26 St. Anne and St. Joachim, Parents of the BVM

On this day, we honour the lives of Mary's parents, the earthly grandparents of Jesus. As existing information about them comes from the Gospel of James and Catholic legend, there is debate over the details of their lives. But regardless, it can be agreed that to be the parents of Jesus' earthly mother, St. Anne and St. Joachim must have been faithful, devoted parents indeed. The patronage of St. Anne includes grandparents, couples without children, women in labour and barren women. Likewise, St. Joachim is considered the patron of grandfathers, fathers and grandparents. *In their home, Mary came into the world, accompanied by the extraordinary mystery of the Immaculate Conception. Mary grew up in the home of Joachim and Anne, surrounded by their love and faith: in their home she learned to listen to the Lord and to follow his will. Saints Joachim and Anne were part of a long chain of people who had transmitted their faith and love for God, expressed in the warmth and love of family life, down to Mary, who received the Son of God in her womb and who gave him to the world, to us.*

IV World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

'Do not cast me off in my old age' (cfr. Sal 71:9)

The **IV World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly** will be celebrated on **Sunday, 28 July 2024**. The theme chosen by the Holy Father – "Do not cast me off in my old age" (cf. *Psalms* 71:9) – is meant to call attention to the fact that, sadly, loneliness is the bitter lot in life of many elderly persons, so often the victims of the throw-away culture, including euthanasia and MAID.

In this year of preparation for the Jubilee, which the Holy Father wishes to be devoted to prayer, the theme of the World Day is taken from Psalm 71, the plea of an elderly person who reflects on the story of his friendship with God.

By cherishing the charisms of grandparents and the elderly, and the contribution they make to the life of the Church, the World Day seeks to support the efforts of every ecclesial community to forge bonds between the generations and to combat loneliness, in the awareness that – as Scripture states – "It is not good for man to be alone" (*Gen* 2:18).
