The Third Sunday of Advent

"Rejoice: the Lord is nigh." As Christmas draws near, the Church emphasizes the joy which should be in our hearts over all that the birth of our Savior means for us. The great joy of Christians is to see the day drawing nigh when the Lord will come again in His glory to lead them into His kingdom. The oft-repeated *Veni* ("Come") of Advent is an echo not only of the prophets but also of the conclusion of the Apocalypse of St. John: "Come, Lord Jesus," the last words of the New Testament.

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as *Gaudete* Sunday. The term *Gaudete* refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice." Rose vestments are worn to emphasize our joy that Christmas is near, and we also light the rose candle on our Advent wreath.

The Advent Wreath

A third candle (pink) is lit on the Advent Wreath for the third Sunday of Advent. This candle, often called the Shepherd's Candle or the Joy Candle, represents joy, such as the joy the shepherds experienced when the angel told them that Christ was to be born.

3rd Advent: Don't worry! Be happy!

"I want you to be happy, always be happy in the Lord; I repeat, what I want is your happiness. Let your tolerance be evident to everyone; the Lord is very near" (Philippians 4:4)

Today is "Gaudete Sunday," a Sunday for rejoicing. Yes, we are waiting; yes, our longed-for Saviour is still on the way; but the time of his arrival grows very near. Today's gospel highlights the message of John the Baptist that he is not the Christ. 'I baptize you with water, but someone is coming, who is more powerful than me, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.' (John 3:16)

St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians painted the authentic picture of "Gaudete Sunday", a moment to pause the usual attitude of watchfulness, readiness and constancy in prayer, and to focus on a somewhat foretaste of Christmas. This message of joy is seen in the three readings of today.

However, it is important to remark that over and above this joyful mood of today's readings, the heart of today's message has a thing about kindness, empathy and compassion. Especially, in the gospel where John the Baptist said, "Anyone who has two tunics must share with the one who has none, and anyone with something to eat must do the same.' (Luke 3:11)Kindness, care, empathy and compassion - these are among the defining values of every human being.

Further in his letter to the Philippians, St. Paul told us never to worry (4:6). But it is so difficult not to be worried about one thing or the other in this life. When I was going through the readings of today and came across the name of the country – Israel (Zephaniah 3:14).Immediately, I started thinking about what is happening between Israel and Palestine. Then, I was worried. Feeling for the people of Gaza and also for the Israelis still being held hostage for over a year (what a trauma!).

What can I do about this situation?

I am not Benjamin Netanyahu (the Prime Minister of Israel), I am Fr. Benjamin Ezekwudo and there is little I can do in this capacity. Yet, there is so much I could do by keeping that region in my prayers; as St. Paul urged us to pray for whatever we need, whatever is troubling us (Philippians 4:6).

Today's lessons have deep connections to the essential values of all humanity, to be compassionate is to be fundamentally human and humane simultaneously. It is at the heart of what makes every person human. Our world today is in dire need of leaders (not politicians) with compassionate spirits who can easily see the pain and abandonment of others and get involved (yielding).

Christmas is the greatest yielding ever known in recorded history. It is the yielding of divinity to humanity, the abandonment of glory to pain, suffering and betrayal, the emptying of the greatest power and splendour and the taking of the form of nothingness (human) so as to restore the nothingness to a nobler and more graceful somethingness (status). God becoming man that man might become God. That was the greatest compassionate act ever know in recorded history.
