4thAdvent: Acting on our belief

'Blessed is she who believed that the promise made to her by the Lord would be fulfilled.' (Luke 1:45)

Today is the last Sunday of Advent, meaning that Christmas is at the corner. The readings of today invite us to believe that all God promised will come to pass. Believing is not easy!

Virgin Mary is blessed because she not only believed but also acted on her belief. Immediately, after the visit from the angel Gabriel, she went with haste to visit Elizabeth. Both Elizabeth and Mary are for us vivid examples of how God works in near impossible situations. Elizabeth was said to be barren, but God did more by making it possible for her to conceive even in her old age. Mary herself had wondered how she could conceive, having had no intimate relation with a man. Again, God does it in His own way and awesomely. As the angel said, with God nothing is impossible. Mary believed it and reaped the fruit of her belief.

Wonderful things happen for those who believe. However, it is not simply a matter of believing, but of believing and acting on that belief. It is a question of hearing the word and doing it (James 1:22), and making sacrifices because of it.

In the Bible (especially the gospels) we see faith in action:

- Jesus said to the centurion, 'Go; be it done for you as you have believed,' and his servant was cured (Matthew 8:13).
- To the woman with the haemorrhage he said, 'Take heart, daughter, you faith has made you well,' and her bleeding stopped (Matthew 9:22).
- To the two blind men Jesus said, 'According to your faith, be it done to you, and they got their sight back' (Matthew 9:29).

All of Jesus' preaching had as its aim to elicit faith in people's hearts. Faith (believing) doesn't always make things easy. In fact, the opposite is more likely to be the case. It is because we have faith that we refuse to give up. Faith impels us to persevere; a person with faith never gives up.

'Faith is a personal act - the free response of the human person to the initiative of God who reveals himself. But faith is not an isolated act. No one can believe alone, just as no one can live alone. You have not given yourself faith as you have not given yourself life. The believer has received faith from others and should hand it

on to others. Our love for Jesus and for our neighbor impels us to speak to others about our faith. Each believer is thus a link in the great chain of believers. I cannot believe without being carried by the faith of others, and by my faith I help support others in the faith.' (CCC: 166)

Although, challenges of life and other existential difficulties tend to discourage us from believing and acting on it. We are admonished today never to give way to such hopelessness. God has a plan for us which we must strive to claim.

God has always great surprises for us. It is left to us to bend our wills to his own will which holds better promises of life, joy and peace. Mary teaches us a great deal through her fiat: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. Let it be done to me according to your word." And with that she was favoured by God.

Finding favour means many things. In Virgin Mary's case, finding favour means a grace bestowed out of privilege for a particular role. We too have found favour with God through the grace he has bestowed on us. This grace pulls us in the right direction. It strengthens us when we are weak. It works in us in many ways because God has made us his children.

Holy Family: Listening Hearts

"There is a difference between listening and waiting for your turn to speak" Simon Sinek

Catholic Church, all over the world, celebrates today the Feast of the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Family is defined as "a divinely instituted community of persons made of husband, wife, children; open to life in love." The Christian family is a communion of persons, a sign and image of the communion of the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit. In the procreation and education of children it reflects the Father's work of creation. It is called to partake of the prayer and sacrifice of Christ. (CCC: 2205)

All families desire to be peaceful, prayerful, loving and happy. However, in modern society there are common family challenges that mitigate the flow of happiness and peace. Some of these challenges include:

- i. financial crisis;
- ii. the problem of leadership in the family;
- iii. upbringing of children;
- iv. respect for one another;
- v. forgiveness; ...the list can go on....

Third on the above list played out in today's gospel between Mary and Joseph. At the age of twelve, Jesus was taken to Jerusalem to celebrate the feast of the Passover. The family is the original cell of social life. It is the natural society in which husband and wife are called to give themselves in love and in the gift of life. Authority, stability, and a life of relationships within the family constitute the foundations for freedom, security, and fraternity within society. The family is the community in which, from childhood, one can learn moral values, begin to honor God, and make good use of freedom. Family life is an initiation into life in society.' (CCC: 2207)

As Mary and Joseph set out on the return journey Jesus got left behind, and it wasn't until the end of the first day that he was missed. It was no joke - a small boy lost in a large city. Yet no one was to blame. It was the result of a misunderstanding. Misunderstandings occur even in the best families.

Mary and Joseph began a frantic search for Jesus. Failing to find him among their fellow pilgrims, they returned to the city to look for him. When at last they found him, their first question was very understandable, 'why did you do this to us?'

And he replied, 'I did it because I must be about my Father's business.' Though they didn't understand his explanation, they took him home.

Handling family challenges is no small feat. Today very many families are under siege from all fronts. Attacks on family values is on the rise. The Holy Family faced trials and threats from without, but were united within because they loved one another, prayed and listened to the Word of God.

Remember how Joseph listened and obeyed the instruction he received in his dream (Matthew 2:13). And he was responsible for the safety and wellbeing of Jesus and Mary while in Egypt. Mary, on her own part, remembered and pondered everything in her heart (Luke 2:51).

Listening is a very important part of being a parent. Listening with our ears and listening with our hearts. We have to listen to what a child is saying with words and without them. Bryant McGill said, "one of the most sincere forms of respect is actually listening to what another has to say"

As we celebrate the Holy Family today, let us strive to build God-centered families where God takes precedence and where peace, love and happiness reign.
