(LifeSiteNews)- In Canada, we kill the disabled. Over <u>90% of babies diagnosed</u> with Down syndrome in the womb are aborted; pre-born children diagnosed with other disabilities usually meet the same fate.

With the <u>expansion of euthanasia eligibility</u> to those suffering solely from disability or mental illness scheduled to come into effect in 2027, that is slated to change. Disability groups have been nearly unanimous in their condemnation of this plan, which has been delayed twice by the Liberal government due to pushback from across Canadian society – but not cancelled entirely.

Canadians with physical disabilities have been attempting to get the government's attention for years, with stories of those who seeking euthanasia because they cannot get the support or care they need periodically dominating international headlines.

The road to hell is paved with good intentions, and this is exactly what the Assisted Dying Bill opens the door to. It starts with "choice" and "dignity." But suicide isn't only done "when the patient wants it." And the countries where it is already legalized have shown us the grim reality. In the Netherlands, 40% of euthanasia deaths occur without patient consent. In Canada, it has been offered to Paralympians who only asked for a mobility aid. If it can happen there, it will happen here. People will be killed against their will!

15th Sunday: Compassion

"The purpose of human life is to serve, and to show compassion and the will to help others." Albert Schweitzer

Compassion is an *expressive* manifestation of love and care. It is, pre-eminently, the face of love and in a deep way, the true manifestation of God. It also signifies a feeling of deep solidarity with the human race.

According to Joan Halifax, 'Compassion may be defined as the capacity to be attentive to the experience of others, to wish the best for others, and to sense what will truly serve others.'

The gospel of Luke(10: 25-37) presents compassionas a major foundation of human virtue. The Samaritan, unlike the priest and Levite, was sensitive to the condition of the man who was beaten up and wounded by the robbers. The Samaritan was just a passer-by, on his way from Jerusalem to Jericho; but he was able to show compassion more than religious leaders.

In truth, religion should be the seat of compassion butthe reality at times is different. Two people at the helm of affairs in religion, looked the other way when they came across the injured man. Religion would lose its taste and meaning if men and women of our time become so insensitive that happenstance in our lives no longer affect one another. When we reach that level of aloneness with each other such that everything that is genuinely human fails to find an echo in our hearts.

"Religion is meant to teach us true spiritual human character. It is meant for self-transformation. It is meant to transform anxiety into peace, arrogance into humility, envy into compassion, to awaken the pure soul in man and his love for the Source, which is God," Radhanath Swami.

Our faith-community should serve as avenues for spiritual growth and enhancing life. If it does not, there will be no need for communion, no need for community and no necessity for religion. For religion fundamentally is the living in unity, peace and progress among men and women.

Glennon D. Melton said, "Compassion does not just happen. Pity does, but compassion is not pity. It's not a feeling. Compassion is a viewpoint, a way of life, a perspective, a habit that becomes a discipline - and more than anything else, compassion is a choice we make that love is more important than comfort or convenience."

Imagine replaying the bible incident (attack on an innocent person, leaving the victim half-dead) in today's world. A lot of people that will show up at the scene would bring out their cell phones to capture what happened to the man (his predicament); and will post it on their social media handle. With the sole intention of gathering 'likes' and 'comments' etc. This is no compassion rather trying to profit out of another's misery. The use of cell phones and the manner in which these gadgets have so enslaved us to ourselves, would eventually drive us into a situation of 'aloneness with the alone'.

Where there is no human connection, there is no compassion. Without compassion, then community, commitment, kindness, human understanding, and peace all shrivel. Individuals become isolated, the isolated turn cruel, and the tragic hovers in the forms of domestic and civil violence.

Anyonecan be in need of compassion or in need of help. We should be willing and be ready, even be courageous enough to show compassion, to show mercy and to get involved in helping others.
