July is the Month of the Precious Blood

The month of July traditionally honors the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. It is the blood of Christ, the Lamb of God, which cleanses us from sin—therefore the Church developed a devotion to Jesus' physical blood and its mystical power, just as it did for His Sacred Heart from which His blood poured out on the Cross. The Precious Blood of Jesus courses through the Church spiritually, giving eternal life to the Body of Christ through the sacraments. Many saints had a devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus, especially St. Catherine of Siena. Devotion to the Precious Blood spread widely through the preaching of Saint Gaspar del Bufalo, who was a 19th-century priest and the founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. This devotion was later approved and recommended by the Holy See. The feast day of the Most Precious Blood of Jesus is July 1st.


It can add a lot of time and effort on the volunteer's part if items left at grave sites are left to deteriorate. Thank you, God Bless!

As we celebrate this beautiful country and all we've been given, we are reminded of how much we have to be grateful for not only for our blessings, but for the trust we place in the One who provides them. In the **Parable of the Sower**, Jesus teaches us that the seed the Word of God falls on all kinds of ground, but only takes root and bears fruit in good soil. We are like that soil, called to be open, trusting, and prepared to receive what God gives.



14th Sunday: Spreading the Gospel

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, ... I am with you always, until the end of time." (Matthew 28: 18-20)

In the gospel, Jesus sent out 70 disciples 'on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to come' (Luke10:1). Today more than ever, the call to be missionaries is very urgent. We are the new disciples of Jesus. Every Christian who professes the name of God shares in this mission: the priest as well as the congregation, the parents as well as the children. The call is still coming to each person in his or her own life-uniqueness and at his or her own level.

Each of us should have the mind and heart of a missionary. We should be open to the needs of others. The young people must be open to corrections and to learn the best route to happiness. Parents must wake up to their responsibilities and do more by the witness of a good Christian life. Priests must be prepared to teach more by their lifestyles than by what they preach.

There was a youth rally in England and young people from many nations were discussing how the Christian "Good News" might be spread. They talked about propaganda by way of the print and electronic media, by pamphlets and radio sermons. They talked about video productions.

Then a girl from Central Africa spoke. She said, "When we want to bring Christ's message to a village, we don't send them preachers or books. We choose a good Christian family to go and live there. Their Christian example usually changes the village."

There is an old saying: "Words push; examples pull."

Any good Christian is a walking Bible, even though he or she has never quoted a verse. In fact, good Christian example may be the only Gospel illiterate people can read.
