VATICAN APPROVED EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE IN INDIA ON MAY 10, 2025

On May 10, 2025, the Vatican officially recognized and confirmed this Eucharistic miracle in Kerala, India, where the face of Jesus miraculously appeared on a consecrated host during a Catholic Mass offered by a priest named Fr. Thomas Patikkal in the Archdiocese of Thalassery, on November 13, 2013. The announcement of the Vatican's approval by the Archbishop Mar Joseph Pamplani at Vilakkannur Church — the site of the 2013 miracle, follows a comprehensive 12-year investigation, which included both scientific and medical examinations of the phenomenon.

The miraculous Host had been sent to the archdiocese for observation and safekeeping. CatholicVote org reported on May 12, 2025 that from "September 2018 to January 2020, the archdiocese sent the Host back to Vilakkannur Church for public veneration. The Syro-Malabar Church's Theological Commission, which investigated the event, found strong theological grounds supporting that it was a Eucharistic miracle. In January 2020, the Host was taken to the Syro-Malabar headquarters in Kakkanad and presented to then-apostolic nuncio Archbishop Giambattista Diquattro. Archbishop Pamplani told the congregation that the Holy See found that the miracle deepens faith in the Real Presence of the Eucharist, and thus permitted the faithful to honor the miraculous Host in the same way the faithful honor the Blessed Sacrament. The archbishop added that the reality of the True Presence is a doctrine of the Catholic faith and does not depend on miraculous appearances. The official proclamation will take place May 31, 2025 at Vilakkannur Church, and Pope Leo XIV's representative in India, Apostolic Nuncio Archbishop Leopoldo Girelli, will preside over the Mass."

Update in MAiD: A special committee if MPs and Senators studying MAiD has recommended allowing MAiD for mature minors. A mature minor is a child or teen who is deemed capable of making a decision for Maid. **This would essentially remove minimum age of eligibility.** The committee also suggested parents may NOT be consulted and wouldn't need to consent to their child's death via MAiD.

Prayer For The Nation's Children



6th Sunday of Easter: God's gift of Peace

"Peace is the first thing the angels sang." John Keble

When Jesus appeared to the disciples after the resurrection, he didn't blame them or even scold them for deserting him. Instead, he broke through the closed doors of fear and doubt and spoke the words they desperately needed to hear. He said, 'Peace be with you' (Luke 24:36). And by means of those lovely words he turned their despair into hope, and their sadness into joy.

Jesus was able to offer peace to his disciples because he had it himself, 'Peace, I bequeath you, **my own peace** I give you, a peace which the world cannot give, this is my gift to you' (John 14:27). Peace is communion with God. Since Jesus is in perfect communion with God the Father, he can give us the gift of peace.

As Christians, we are called to proclaim and spread the vocation to peace. Peace is one of the greatest gifts we can give to one another. But we can't give it if we haven't got it, just as we can't give money to a beggar if our own pocket is empty. And we cannot give peace to someone who doesn't want it. We can only create the conditions where peace is able to take root, but we can't impose peace.

Merriam-Webster Dictionary defined peace 'as a state of tranquility or quiet; harmony in personal relations (absence of war or dissension)'.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church described peace as "the tranquillity of order". Peace is the work of justice and the effect of charity.(CCC: 2304)

Earthly peace is the image and fruit of the peace of Christ, the messianic "Prince of Peace." By the blood of his Cross …he reconciled men with God and made his Church the sacrament of the unity of the human race and of its union with God. "He is our peace." He has declared: "Blessed are the peacemakers." (CCC: 2305)

"Peace is not a relationship of nations. It is a condition of mind brought about by a serenity of soul. Peace is not merely the absence of war. It is also a state of mind. Lasting peace can come only to peaceful people." Jawaharlal Nehru

For Thomas Merton, 'Peace demands the most heroic labor and the most difficult sacrifice. It demands greater heroism than war. It demands greater fidelity to the truth and a much more perfect purity of conscience.'

John F. Kennedy said that peace is a daily, a weekly, a monthly process, gradually changing opinions, slowly eroding old barriers, quietly building new structures.

A man was watching some children at play. He asked them what they were playing, and they said, "We're playing war."

Then he remarked to them, "Why is it that you are always playing war? Don't you know what a horrible thing war is? Why don't you play peace sometimes?"

The children agreed that they would like to play peace. But then they looked at one another and started a small discussion among themselves and then everyone went silent. Finally, one little boy came up to the man and asked, "Mister, how do we play peace?"
