Synod on Synodality

Implementing a SYNODAL WAY of Proclaiming Christ and God's Kingdom today

Bishop Mark Hagemoen is inviting the entire diocese to join in deepening "communion, participation, and mission" through the Implementation Phase of the Synod on Synodality. The bishop will officially launch this next phase of the synod at celebration of Mass on the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica 9 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 9, 2025. Celebration of the Feast of St. John Lateran: The Celebration of Our Participation in Life, Passion, Death, & Resurrection of the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Do you not know that Gods Spirit dwells in you? (1 Corinthians 3:16)

Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Diocese of Saskatoon:

This year of the Jubilee Pilgrimage of hope has seen the death of Pope Francis and the election of Pope Leo XIV. One pope started us on this pilgrimage journey of hope – which also features the call to be a more synodal church. And now Pope Leo has confirmed this call and work. At a recent Jubilee of Synodal Teams, Pope Leo said that synodality will "help the church fulfill its primary role in the world, which is to be missionary, to announce the Gospel, to give witness to the person of Jesus Christ in every part of the world, to the ends of the earth."

This is, of course the mission of the Church at every level, and in every setting! Synodality is indeed a way of walking our journey of missionary discipleship in unity with Jesus Christ, inspired and led by the Holy Spirit. In this walk, we are inspired by the Synod on Synodality that has listened in the Spirit to the voices of people from around the world over a multi-year process of discernment. The Final Document released by the Synod of Bishops calls for intentional focus and an ongoing journey of conversion to become a more synodal church of communion, participation and mission – and the Holy Father is now asking dioceses around the world to implement this synodal vision.

Thus, I am pleased as your bishop to announce the "implementation phase" of the synodal process for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon. Our implementation phase will feature the following:

Firstly, we will continue the conversations in the Spirit that have happened to date at the local and diocesan levels about the meaning and practical features of synodality.

Secondly, we will link the implementation features of synodality to our Diocesan Pastoral Plan. We have put a lot of prayer, discernment, and work into this plan – which has been a source of renewal and focus for all of our diocese. However, the pastoral plan can be greatly improved by being infused with the spirit of synodality – just as the Beatitudes (see Matthew 5: 1-16) bring life and character to living out of the Gospel.

Thirdly, as we conclude the Jubille Year of Hope, we also look to another coming great event: the 2000th anniversary in 2033 of the Resurrection of Christ and the Great Commission. What a remarkable and unprecedented opportunity for the celebration of the very season for our hope, and the basis for mission. I pray at this upcoming time will be a real time of deepening conversion for all of us called to the mission of Jesus Christ to save and bless His people.

Fourthly, this implementation phase is being announced for our diocese on the Feast of St. John Lateran – a day when the Church celebrates the great temple and Pope's cathedral church as the mother church for all the world. It is also a day when we are reminded – as missionary disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ – of His call to us all to be His temples in and for the world. As St. Casesarius of Arles, bishop, states,

"...we are to be the true and living temple of God...let the light of good works shine in us ... God wishes to enter in to our souls, for He promised: I shall live in them, and I shall walk the corridors of their hearts."

May our synod implementation plan help each of us to be better temples of the life of God – within ourselves and four our parishes, diocese, and larger communities. May we approach the synod implementation phase – not as another task or plan to be accomplished – but as a real time of patient listening to the Holy Spirit, who calls us to a new a greater awareness of not only the goal and destination, but also the journey along the way.

I conclude with this inspiration from St. Mother Teresa – who is a great teacher about the synodal features of empathy and attentive listening:

"We are called to be contemplatives in the heart of the world by seeking the face of God in everything, everyone, everywhere, all the time, and His hand in every happening." (St Teresa of Calcutta)

Diocesan Prayer:

We pray for all the baptized in our diocese as together we embark on the implementation of the Synod on Synodality, listening patiently to each other and to the Holy Spirit.

Dedication of St. John Lateran Basilica: Why a universal feast?

It is good and enriching to be often searching into the things of God, and trying the depth of them, not only to look on the surface, but to go to the bottom of them as far as we can, into the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven.

We celebrate today the Feast of the Dedication of St. John Lateran Basilica in Rome. Dedicated in 324 A.D, the Basilica is the cathedral of Rome, the official seat of the Bishop of Rome (Pope Leo XIV) and the mother of all churches throughout the world. It is the first public building granted to Christians as a worship site by Constantine.

In front of St. John Lateran Basilica, it is written: "The sacred mother and head of all the churches of the city and of the world." This explains why we celebrate this feast universally.

St. John Lateran Basilica stands today as a symbol of the living Church. It is a reminder that our faith is universal and our Church exists across time and in all places. It stands as our spiritual home, a place where our spiritual family gathers to worship, to pray, to partake in the sacraments and to encounter the love of God. [Vatican News]

In the gospel today, Jesuschased away people trading inside the temple of Jerusalem. The temple was the center of Jewish life at the time of Jesus and basically all over the world– Celtic, Germanic tribe, Roman Empire, Parthian Empire, Nabataea civilization, Han Dynasty, Kingdom of Kush, Kingdom Aksum, Mayan and Teotihuacan Civilizations and numerous others. In the ancient time, temple was a place to gather and worship for all major feasts and celebrations. [Google]

As recorded in the bible, the life of a Jew revolved around the temple. The temple drew the people together as one and reminded them of God's constant love and protection. And the life of Jesus was no exception:

- From birth (Luke 2:21-35)
- Coming of age (Luke 2:41-52)
- Remembrance of Passover (John 13:1-10)
- Feast of harvest (Exodus 23:16) etc.

St. John Lateran is special because it was the first structure built for public Christian worship in Rome. It is not just the cathedral of Rome; it sets the standard for all

Christian worship spaces. The building itself teaches us that mass is never something we watch like spectators, but something in which we participate.

When Constantine asked Pope Sylvester how big a temple he wanted, and Pope Sylvester replied, "How big can you build it?" - it was revolutionary. The basilica today is the same size as the one Constantine built in the 4th century - it can accommodate up to 5,000 people. [Google]

The book of Prophet Ezekiel (47:1-12) talked about stream coming out from the sanctuary of the temple. Jesus Christ is the sanctuary and from him those living waters flow, out of his pierced side (John 19:34). It is by believing in him that we receive from him blessings of the living water.

Anyone who comes to seek God in the sanctuary with upright heart receives graces. We are called to be channels of grace, having been touched by the waters of the sanctuary. We are the temples of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthian 6:19) and from us is expected to flow the waters of life and healing - agents of divine grace.
