<u>January is the Month of the Holy Name of Jesus</u>

Devotion of the Month

The month of January is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. After the Blessed Virgin Mary conceived by the Holy Spirit, the angel Gabriel appeared to St. Joseph and told him that the Child's name should be called Jesus, meaning "God Saves." According to Jewish law, on the 8th day after his birth a male child was to be circumcised, receive his name, and become a full member of God's covenant people. According to the old Roman liturgical calendar, the Feast of the Circumcision of Jesus was celebrated on January 1st, eight days after Christmas, the same day that He was given His sacred name. Currently we celebrate the Solemnity of the Mother of God on January 1st and honor the Holy Name of Jesus on January 3rd. For Catholics, Jesus' sacred name is the object of a special devotion symbolized by the monogram "IHS," (sometimes called a Christogram), which is the first three letters of the Greek spelling of His name.

The Feast of Epiphany

The feast of Epiphany is the manifestation of the Lord Jesus Christ to the world. Jesus cannot be hidden. He is the shining star, the sun whose rays enlightens every part of the earth and dispels the darkness shrouding the world.

In the Gospel (Matthew 2:1-12), the Magi were led by a star to the small town of Bethlehem. The star led the wise men to the *Star of Jacob*; and they found the new born king through whom God would light up the world. Though coming from a land that worshipped stars, they surrendered that religion as they fell down and worshipped him, who made the stars.

Unfortunately, it is increasingly difficult for the modern man to worship the Giver of gifts instead of the gifts. Modern man worships –

- money instead of God who blesses everyone (Psalm 107:38).
- technology instead of He who grants intelligence (Sirach 17:7).
- fame/popularity instead of He who gives life (Sirach 34:16-17)

When the Magi entered the palace of King Herod to make inquiries(Matthew 2:2), Herod was terrified and became unease. This Herod was an Edomite, made king of Judea by Augustus and Antonius, the then chief rulers of the Roman state. Herod was a man made up of falsehood and cruelty; cruel even to his immediate family.

The news of the new born king troubled Herod deeply. He had the notion that the kingdom of the Messiah would clash and interfere with his powers or the worst unseat him. The Magi never knew that Herod was an enemy. But having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod so they went home through another route.

In our world today, some people will return to Herod not minding the earlier warnings. They will return for what they will gain. Even if they realized that Herod was evil, they will still find excuses to meet with him so far there is something to profit from the visit.

We have a lot to learn from the story of the Magi:

Symbolic Journey: The journey of the Magi is symbolic. It is a symbol of the spiritual journey of each one of us. It was not without difficulties that the Magi came to believe in Jesus. The trip was long and hard. It is equally with great difficulties that many today struggle with their spiritual journey toward God, and we should pray for those whose struggle is hard.

Docility: The Magi followed a star, which led them to a place of overwhelming joy where they found the new born king with his mother – Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph. When they saw him, they knelt down before Jesus and worshipped him. This was an early instance of Christ's victory over the devil, when those who had been star-gazers and of different religion, became the early adorers of the infant Jesus. They paid him homage by gifting him from their treasure chest – Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. Gifts fit for a king.

Eternity: The journey of the Magi is the emblem of a Christian life understood in the terms of detachment, following, and being faithful to the end (eternal life). The three kings left their comfort in search of the revealed truth from God by the means of a star. Anyone who remains tied to that which is material, cannot become a pilgrim towards the eternal life.

Truth: This story also reminds us of the need to become pilgrims of the truth. The action of Herod did not deter the Magi from continuing in their search for the truth. The truth that brings about peace, contentment and joy. The truth of the gospel of Jesus Christ.
