

11th Sunday: A few labourers

“The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest” (Matthew 9:37-38)

It is amazing that this statement made by Jesus more than 2,000 years ago, still reflects today's reality. Labourers are very few even today. How is it that labourers are still few with the population of the world – *circa* 8.3 billion people.^[Google]

At the start of his ministry, Jesus had many disciples and from these he picked out twelve men. He called them apostles. He didn't choose men with high qualifications, high social status or well-connected individuals. No, he chose ordinary people. They came from ordinary walks of life - a number of them were fishermen. Far from being perfect, they possessed the same human faults and failings we find in ourselves.

The twelve apostles are:

- i. **Simon Peter (Cephas):** A fisherman from Bethsaida (John 2:42).
- ii. **Andrew:** Simon Peter's brother and a fellow fisherman (Matthew 4:18).
- iii. **James (Son of Zebedee):** A partner in the family fishing business with his father Zebedee and brother John (Matthew 4:21-22).
- iv. **John (Son of Zebedee):** Brother of James, also a fisherman. He is known in the Bible as “the disciple whom Jesus loved” (John 19:23).
- v. **Matthew (Levi):** A tax collector based in Capernaum (Matthew 9:9).
- vi. **Simon the Zealot:** His designation as a "Zealot" (Luke 6:15^d) strongly suggests he was a member of the radical Jewish political faction dedicated to violently overthrowing Roman rule.

****The trades of the remaining Apostles were unspecified -*

vii. **Philip**

viii. **Bartholomew**

ix. **Thomas (Didymus):** Best known historically as “Doubting Thomas” (John 20:24)

x. **James (Son of Alphaeus)**

xi. **Thaddaeus (Judas, son of James)**

xii. **Judas Iscariot:** Before joining the ministry is unknown, but during Jesus' ministry, he served as the treasurer for the group, keeping charge of the communal money bag - a role he abused (John 12:6).

These men were ordinary people like you and I. They had their shortcomings - **Peter** could blow hot and cold. At times he was as solid as a rock. But at other times he was more like a piece of jelly (Luke 22:57-62). Yet, in spite of everything, his heart was sound. And at the end of the day, it is the heart that matters.

James and **John** (sons of Zebedee) were so hot-tempered that once they wanted Jesus to call down fire and brimstone on Samaritan village that refused to accept him (Luke 9:54). They were also full of personal ambition, and wanted to have the top places in Jesus' kingdom (Matthew 20:20-22), thus causing dissension among other apostles.

Matthew was a member of a hated class - he was a tax collector for the occupying Romans. **Simon** belonged to a band of people called the Zealots whose aim was to get the Romans out of Palestine. Today Simon would be called a rebel. **Thomas** earned himself a nick-name - the Doubter.

Then there was **Judas Iscariot** who betrayed him. God did not predestine Judas to play the role of traitor. Judas became a traitor through the choices he made.

Jesus chose these men because he saw good in each one of them, even in Judas. It shows that one doesn't have to be perfect or possess all the talents in order to work in the vineyard of the Lord.

Choice is a privilege and an honour, but it is also a responsibility. And the apostles were chosen for a task - to help Jesus with the harvest. And through baptism we too are chosen. Though the harvest is immense, there is no need to be discouraged. We can't do everything, but we can do something.
