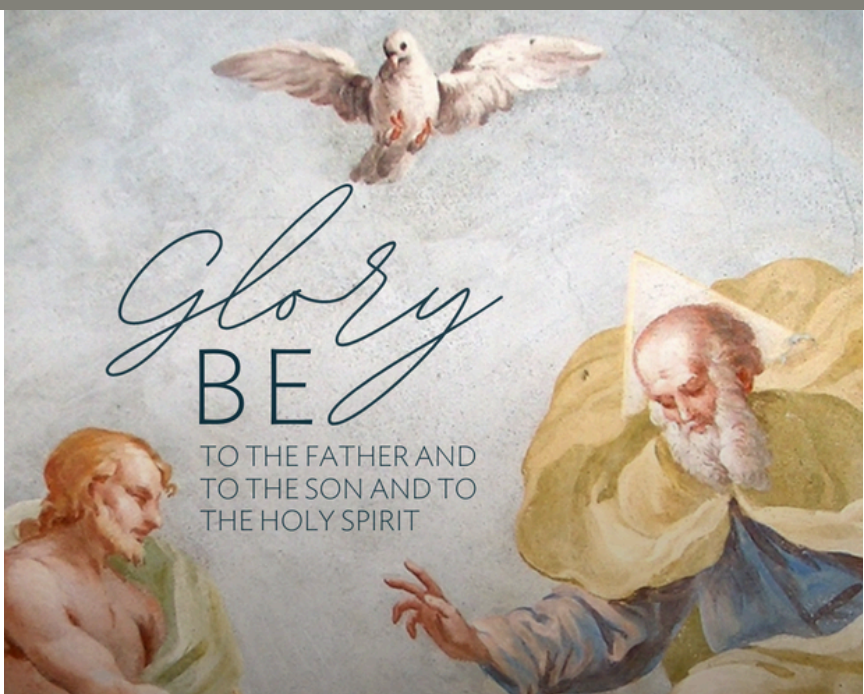
Reminders:

Pentecost Sunday: Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Prior to the descent of the Holy Spirit the apostles were virtually living in hiding in the upper room (John 20:19). A great task had been entrusted to them, yet they had neither the strength nor the will to begin it. But after the coming of the Holy Spirit they were changed people. They left their hiding place, and set out courageously to preach the Gospel.

In the Acts of Apostles, Jesus made a promised to the apostles, 'You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem, but... to the ends of the earth.' (Acts 1:8)

The key word here is the word 'power'. Here 'Power' means 'dunamis' (δύναμις) in Greek. This is the most famous ancient Greek word for power, meaning inherent strength, ability, or miraculous power. Power was precisely what they needed. At the moment they felt completely powerless. They were crippled with fear, had a sense of inadequacy and were totally incapable of carrying out the task of preaching the Gospel and witnessing to Jesus.

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are:

- Wisdom
- Understanding
- Counsel
- Fortitude
- Knowledge
- Piety
- Fear of the Lord

In the Catholic and Christian tradition, the Gifts of the Holy Spirit are divine graces that perfect the virtues of those who receive them. They are famously rooted in the Old Testament book of Prophet Isaiah (11:2-3) and are fully infused into a believer during the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Each of these gifts help us understand God and live as disciples of Jesus:

1. Wisdom

Wisdom is not just ordinary intelligence, but the ability to see things from God's perspective. It allows a person to value spiritual things over worldly ones, helping us to judge all things according to divine truth.

2. Understanding

While wisdom is the desire to contemplate the things of God, **understanding** is the tool that helps us do it. It allows us to grasp the deeper meaning of the truths of the faith, the Bible, and the sacraments, moving us past a superficial understanding of God's word.

3. Counsel

Counsel is a form of supernatural common sense. It helps us to judge promptly and rightly what ought to be done, especially in difficult or morally vague situations. It guides us to choose the actions that best glorify God and lead to our salvation.

4. Knowledge

Knowledge allows us to see the deep connection between God and his creation. It helps us understand the true value of created things and keeps us from making idols out of them. Through knowledge, we can clearly see the hand of God at work in our daily lives.

“The Church teaches that the one true God, our Creator and Lord, can be known with certainty from his works, by the natural light of human reason.” (CCC:47)

5. Fortitude

Fortitude gives us the strength to stand up for our faith and do what is right, even when facing persecution, hardship, or social pressure. It helps us overcome fear and persevere through difficult spiritual trials.

“Fortitude...ensures firmness in difficulties and constancy in the pursuit of the good. It strengthens the resolve to resist temptations and to overcome obstacles in the moral life.” (CCC:1808)

6. Piety

Piety is a deep, loving devotion to God as our merciful Father. It inspires a profound respect for holy things, a desire to worship him, and a natural instinct to love and serve our neighbors because they are also children of God.

“The religious sense of the Christian people has always found expression in various forms of piety surrounding the Church's sacramental life, such as the veneration of relics, visits to sanctuaries, pilgrimages, processions, the stations of the cross, religious dances, the rosary, medals, etc.” (CCC: 1674)

7. Fear of the Lord

This gift is not about being afraid of God's punishment, but rather of absolute amazement in the presence of his perfection and majesty. It stems from a deep love for God that makes us dread offending him or being separated from him.

The seven gifts are not decorations; they are tools for discipleship, given so we can live the Christian life with divine strength. The gifts are given to us, at Confirmation, at Pentecost, and in every sacrament. The moral life of Christians is sustained by the gifts of the Holy Spirit. These are permanent dispositions which make us docile in following the promptings of the Holy Spirit.
