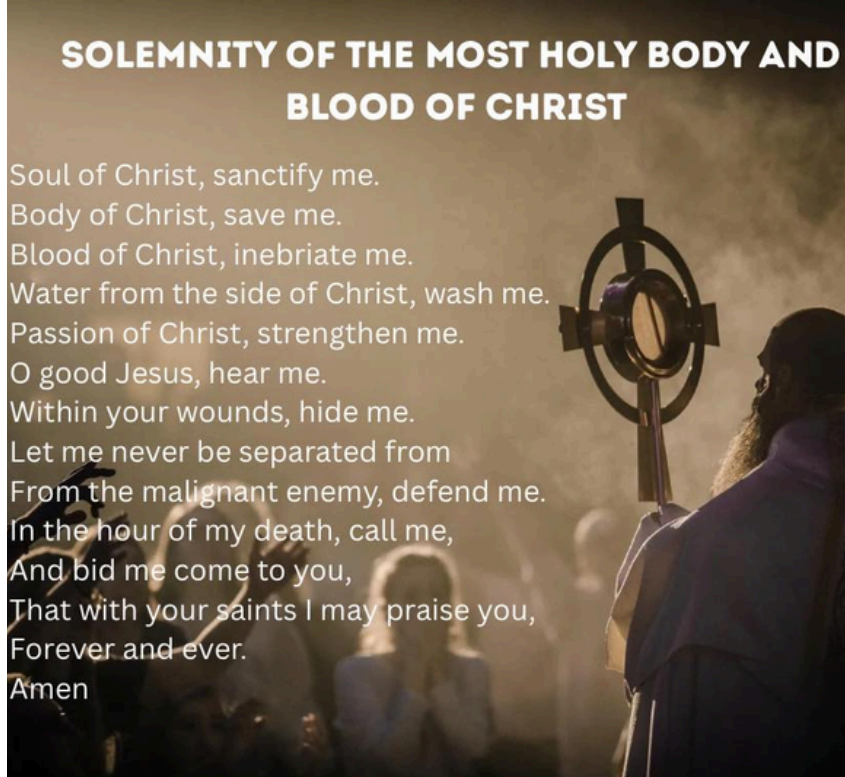
- **Marriage Prep:** Please contact Fr. Benjamin at least one year prior to the desired date of marriage.

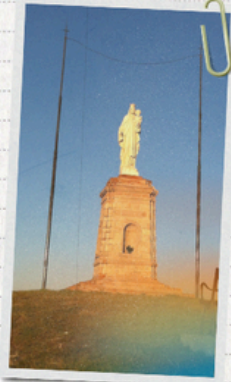

Holy Trinity: Is it in the Bible?

Today we celebrate one of the most difficult, but the central and basic truth of our faith -The mystery of the Blessed Trinity: God the father, God the son and God the Holy Spirit. In summary, there is one God in whom dwells three persons.

“The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential in the teaching of the hierarchy of the truths of faith’...” (CCC:234)

The divine persons are really distinct from one another. "God is one but not solitary." "Father," "Son," "Holy Spirit" are not simply names designating modalities of the divine being, for they are really distinct from one another: “He is not the Father who is the Son, nor is the Son he who is the Father, nor is the Holy Spirit he who is the Father or the Son.” They are distinct from one another in their relations of origin: “It is the Father who generates, the Son who is begotten, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds.” The divine Unity is Triune. (CCC:254)

We have the custom of beginning and ending all important actions by blessing ourselves in the name of the Trinity when we say, ‘in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.’ When we pronounce these familiar names we are affirming our belief that God is not a solitary being, dwelling by himself in splendid isolation, rather is made up of persons.

The doctrine of the Blessed Trinity is very important to our faith that when we admit someone into the Christian fold, we baptize the person in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit - *the Trinitarian rite*.

The Trinity is a mystery of faith in the strict sense, one of the "mysteries that are hidden in God, which can never be known unless they are revealed by God." To be sure, God has left traces of his Trinitarian being in his work of creation and in his Revelation throughout the Old *and New Testament*... (CCC:237)

Here are some of the place, where it is found in the Bible:

- Genesis 1:26 - God said, “Let us make man in our image and likeness”. Most biblical scholars interpret this as referring to the Blessed Trinity.
- John16:13-15, Jesus said, “When the spirit of truth comes, he will lead you to the complete truth... He will glorify me since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine... Every thing the Father has is mine.”

- Matthew 28:19, Jesus instructed the apostles: “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.”
- Other bible verses are: Matthew 3:16-17, 2 Corinthians 13:14, 1 Peter 1:2, Ephesians 4:4-6, Numbers 6:24-26 etc.

St. Patrick use this illustration to explained the Blessed Trinity to the people of Ireland: “Water can exist in three different states: gas (vapour), solid and liquid. When heated it changes into vapour, when frozen - ice, and liquid in its natural state. The above analogy offers us an insight into the Trinity and helps us understand a little about the doctrine.

The Blessed Trinity remains a mystery that our limited intellects will never unravel completely. God is the deepest mystery in our lives and is infinitely more expansive than our tiny minds are capable of imagining. We should never look on the Trinity as a problem to be solved, a puzzle to be worked out or something simply to test our faith. Rather, we are called to believe it with deep faith, reverence and love. For those who believe, no explanation is necessary. For those who do not believe, no explanation is possible.

Blessed Trinity is an existential reality, a mystery that is meant to be lived with faith; and not an idea to be speculated on. God is with us, God is within us, God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, are active within us and making it possible for us to lead a Christian life and to aspire to that complete union with God when we shall see him face to face and will be made like him in the heavenly kingdom (Revelation 22:4-5).
